The Parties to this MoU are:-

- (1) The Czech Paralympic Committee ('CPC')
- (2) The Czech Sports Organisation for Physically Disabled Athletes ('CSOPD')
- (3) The Czech Sports Association for Physically Handicapped Athletes ('CSAPH')

The Parties agree as follows;

- The CPC will adopt a new constitution by 31 March 2012 and will deliver a copy to the IPC by that date. The new constitution must be acceptable to the IPC and must guarantee the democratic and non-discriminatory treatment of all the CPC members. The new Constitution will reference the merger of CSOPD and CSAPH into a single body by the 31 December 2012. The new constitution will only permit two bodies representing athletes with physical disability until 31 December 2012.
- In order to assist in the drafting of the new constitution the parties will seek the assistance and guidance of the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport of the Czech Republic and the Committee on Science, Education, Culture, Youth and Sports of the Parliament of the Czech Republic, Chamber of Deputies.
- The CSOPD will receive financial support during the transition period pending the merger of CSOPD and CSAPH of an amount of money that will be calculated on the same basis as is used to establish the payments made to CSAPH. Payments to CSOPD and CSAPH will be made on the same dates.
- All parties will use their best endevours to resolve the '911 Case' and the distraint procedure that has arisen as a consequence of that case.
- The Parties will deliver to the IPC an agreed timetable for the merger of the CSOPD and CSAPH with the copy of the CPC revised constitution, i.e. by 31 March 2012.
